ANTHESIS DELIVERS LETTERS TO STATE LEGISLATURES ASKING THEM TO "KEEP THE PROMISE"

In May, a group of program participants and staff were able to deliver over 200 advocacy letters from all of our programs to the offices of Senator Connie Leyva and Assemblyman Freddie Rodriguez. Supporters of services for individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities got serious this year about demanding funding relief from our legislators and the governor's office as they worked through the final phases of the 2019-20 California State budget. Our participants and staff attended a rally in Los Angeles, they signed the advocacy letter and made phone calls to bring attention to the dire need for additional funding for programs like Anthesis throughout the State. Our efforts were successful, as an 8% average funding increase was included in the budget this year. This is a great relief but not enough to stabilize the funding system and we will continue to advocate for implementation of the Rate Study that was presented to the Legislature in March. Everyone associated with Anthesis is doing their civic duty and fighting for their fair share of funding.
